Kindergarten & Pre-Primary Enrolments 2022

Applications available now

Kindergarten Enrolments 2022 **

We are taking Enrolments for Kindergarten 2022. If your child turns 4 by 30 June 2022, they are eligible to Enrol for Kindergarten.


Applying for Kindergarten

Western Australia now has immunisation laws that will help to better protect our children and the wider community from vaccine-preventable diseases.

When you enrol your child in Kindergarten you will need to provide your child's current Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement, which shows your child is 'up-to-date' with all the scheduled immunisations (according to the National Immunisation Program) for their age. This Statement must be no more than two months old.

If you would like to know more about the immunisation requirements, obtaining an AIR Immunisation History Statement or how to access immunisation services go to HealthyWA.

In most cases, your child will be offered a place at your local public school or a Community Kindergarten linked to your local school. However, if the number of Kindergarten applications exceeds the number of places available, you may be referred to a nearby Kindergarten which has places available. Every effort is made to accommodate your child in a school as close as possible to your home.



If your child is 5 years old by 30 June 2022 you need apply to enrol them in Pre Primary for 2022.

Every child of Pre Primary age is required to attend school and is guaranteed a place at their local intake school.

If your child is currently enrolled in Kindergarten at your local intake school and you plan to stay at that school for Pre Primary, you still need to complete an application to re-enrol. If you reside out of the local intake area you will not be guaranteed a spot, but will be considered if you complete an Application with all required documents and a letter to explain why you wish to request an out of boundary enrolment.





Influenza

Influenza, or the 'flu' is caused by an influenza virus. It is spread through the air when someone coughs, sneezes or talks. It is also spread by touching something that has the virus on it and then touching your nose, eyes or mouth. Common symptoms include sore throat, cough, fever, headache, chills, tiredness and muscle aches.

People with the flu should rest and drink plenty of fluid. Use paracetamol in recommended doses if necessary - but do not give children any medication containing aspirin.

Be sure to keep your child home from school while he or she is sick. If you require school work for your child contact the school to prepare some for you to collect.

The best way to prevent flu from spreading is by washing your hands regularly and after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.

Warden Avenue Immunisation Clinic Immunisation is a safe and effective way of protecting against harmful disease. The clinic provides immunisations free of charge through the National Immunisation Program for: · Childhood vaccinations · School based programs · Influenza vaccinations for primary school years . Why should I consider having my child vaccinated against the flu?

The National Health and Medical Research Council, Australia's peak body for health advice, recommends annual vaccination for anyone six months of age or older who wants to reduce their chances of becoming ill with the flu.

Annual flu vaccination is strongly recommended for anyone six months of age or older with a medical condition that places them at higher risk of severe illness from flu. Children and adults with heart, lung or kidney disease or a weakened immune system, are eligible for free flu vaccine through the National Immunisation Program.

Children without underlying medical conditions who become infected with flu can also develop serious illnesses. Flu can cause high fever and pneumonia, and make existing medical conditions worse. Flu can also cause convulsions and diarrhoea in children. This year the flu vaccine is also available free for Primary School Aged children (Kindy to Year 6) as part of the National Immunisation Program.

Influenza viruses are always changing. Each year scientists try to match the strains of influenza viruses in the vaccine to those most likely to cause flu illnesses that year. It takes up to two weeks for protection to develop after vaccination against flu and protection lasts about a year.

The seasonal flu vaccine is available on prescription or via GP's and immunisation clinics and is provided free for certain groups.
