




### **Parent Representative Vacancy**

APS invites parents to nominate for a vacant position on the School Board. The membership would be for a period of three years. All nominations are to be received by the Principal before 4:00pm Friday 25 June 2021.

Parent members of the School Board bring their experience as parents at the school and the views and context of the wider school community to School Board meetings.

#### School Board members may:

- \* help monitor, review and evaluate aspects of the school business planning and are aware of the components of the Statement of Expectations;
- \* endorse the business plan which outlines the key directions of the school;
- \* endorse the annual school report, annual school budget and student performance targets;
- \* endorse financial arrangements necessary to fund school objectives, priorities and directions;
- \* approve charges, contributions and items of personal use (booklists);
- \* help formulate codes of conduct for students; and
- \* promote the school in the community.

#### The School Board does not

- manage the day to day running of the school. For example, it does not employ staff, decide which classes students will be assigned to, or resolve issues relating to individual teachers and students and/or parents;
- discuss individual issues relating to teachers, staff or parents-these are very clearly management roles, and therefore the responsibility of the principal;
- intervene in educational instruction of students.



The theme for NAIDOC Week this year is "Heal Country!", and we will be joined by Larry Blight, local Menang Man, who will share his knowledge on local "Bush Food and Bush Medicine".

Larry is passionate about his Boodja (Land) and all things on it and has extensive knowledge of local bushfoods, medicines, fauna, local stories and traditions. Larry has been passing on this knowledge through cross-cultural awareness workshops, Aboriginal tourism, school educational workshops and more. Larry has helped on archaeological digs and research. His passion to understand and to share not only "what", "where", and "when", but also "why", "how", add dimension and often humour as he tells stories of the Menang people and their history.

#### Fremantle International Portrait Prize 2019, and other tales of a photographer's journey

Award winning photographer, one of Australia's leading photographic educators, and founder of the FIPP, Dale Neill will share the story of the FIPP exhibitions and his journey as a photographer.

Along with founding the FIPP, Dale has led photography tours to Egypt, Turkey, Peru, Colombia, Argentina, Chile, Singapore, Borneo, Bali, Antarctica, Galapagos and Iran.

Following the Boxing Day tsunami in 2004, Dale was part of a mission to India, rescuing and photographing 200 children orphaned by the tsunami. His tsunami images won him the Western Australian Professional Photographer of the Year in 2005.







