### From the Principal's Desk

As the rain eases and the weather warms up, we are in the season of Birak. Many small fledglings will venture out of their nests and reptiles will start shedding their old skin for a new one. Traditionally this was the fire season.

An almost clockwork style of easterly winds in the morning and sea breezes in the afternoon meant that this was burning time of the year for Noongar people and they would burn the country in mosaic patterns. There are several reasons for this, including fuel reduction, increasing the grazing pastures for animals, to aid seed germination and to make it easier to move across the country.

We are now into our final weeks of the school year. There are many important events being held over these weeks, so please refer to our calendar and Connect for information.







# 2021 INTERSCHOOL JUMPS & THROWS AND ATHLETICS





On Friday 26 November 2021 the Green Team (Jamie, Eva, April, Benjamin, Riley and Liliana (absent!) participated in an excursion to Alannah MacTiernan's office and listened to a presentation done by the founder of the seeds in schools' programme Lita O'Keeffe. APS received four boxes filled with roughly 100 packets of seeds per box, absolutely free!

The boxes were sorted into seasons and had characters explaining how to plant, when to plant and what they were to

make it more appealing to younger students. Some of our seeds that we

A single seed contains several different things that all help the new plant to grow and survive. Each seed contains an outer seed coat, an embryo, and most contain an endosperm.

received were Wally's Weird Watermelons, Teddy's Tiny Tomatoes, Sally's Sunshine and Snow and Charlie's Crunchy Cucumbers. These are all heirloom seed varieties to grow at school.

This was all for the purpose of creating a seed library for our school, which will mean that we have an opportunity for students to bring in seeds from home and plant them in the gardens at our school. They will also be able to take home the seeds that fall from the plants when the seasons end. Watch this space for further developments and information about our seed library.

You can learn how to make sustainable pots, reusable greenhouses and water reservoirs from old meat trays and newspapers that would normally be thrown away. We are excited about putting some of these great ideas into practise at APS!


